Marmalade Bar

200g/8oz Self Raising four	1 tsp Mixed spice
100g/4oz Golden caster sugar	1 orange, zested
1/2 Lemon, zested	100g/4oz Mixed dried fruit
140g/5oz Butter	5 tbsp Marmalade
125ml Milk	1 tsp White wine vinegar
2 tbsp Icing sugar	1 tbsp Demerara sugar

Heat oven to 160C/140C fan/gas 3.

Put the flour, mixed spice, caster sugar, zests, dried fruit and a pinch of salt into a large bowl.

Melt the butter and 2 tbsp of the marmalade in a saucepan, then stir in the milk. Pour the liquid into the dry ingredients, add the white wine vinegar and mix well. Pour the cake mixture into a 2lb lined loaf tin and bake for 1 hour, or until an inserted skewer comes out clean.

Meanwhile, make the glaze by heating the remaining marmalade with 2 tbsp water and the icing sugar until bubbling and syrupy.

When the cake is cooked remove it from the oven, pour over the marmalade glaze, then sprinkle with the demerara sugar. Leave to cool in the tin.

For the icing: 100g/4oz butter, softened 175g/6oz Icing sugar					
25g/1oz Light muscovado sugar	1 tsp Vanilla extract				
1 tbsp Milk	1 level tsp Ground cinnamon				

Preheat oven to 180C/Fan 160C/Gas 4. Measure all the tray bake ingredients into a large bowl and beat with an electric mixer until light and fluffy. Turn the mixture into a greased and lined 30x23cm /12x9in traybake tin, level the top. Bake in the oven for 30-35 minutes, or until the cake has shrunk a little from the sides and springs back when pressed in the centre. Leave to cool in the tin.

For the icing, measure all the ingredients into a large bowl and beat with an electric mixer until pale and creamy. Spread over the cold cake and cut into pieces.
