## Lemon Curd Cake

$100 \mathrm{~g} / 4 \mathrm{oz}$ Caster sugar
3 size 3 Eggs
pinch of salt

Heat oven to $170^{\circ} \mathrm{C} / 335^{\circ} \mathrm{F} /$ Gas 3-4 Grease and line a $20.5 \mathrm{~cm} / 8$ in cake tin Cream the sugar and margarine together until light and fluffy. Then add the lemon curd and mix well. Beat in the eggs one at a time with a little flour and salt. Then fold in the remaining flour. Place the mixture in the prepared tin and bake for 1 hour until lightly browned. Leave to cool in tin. Serves 10

## Fruit Malt Loaf

Heat oven to $375^{\circ} \mathrm{F} / 190^{\circ} \mathrm{C} / \mathrm{Gas} 5$.
Put all ingredients into a large bowl. Mix well together till a thick batter is formed.
Turn into well a greased $1 \mathrm{lb} / 450 \mathrm{~g}$ loaf tin. Bake for $1-1 \frac{1}{4}$ hours or till a skewer inserted in the centre comes out clean. Turn out to cool onto a rack. Serve with butter.

## Blondies

175 g Butter, cut into cubes, plus extra for the tin
200 g Light brown soft sugar
100 g Caster sugar
3 Eggs
1tsp Vanilla extract or bean paste
200g Plain flour
½tsp Baking powder
200 g White chocolate, chopped, or use chocolate chips
Melt butter and both sugars in a pan over low heat, adding a pinch of salt if the butter is unsalted. Remove from the heat and leave to cool for 10 mins - this will stop the eggs from curdling when added. Heat oven to $180^{\circ} \mathrm{C} / 160^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ fan $/$ gas 4 . Butter 23 cm square tin or $25 \times 20 \mathrm{~cm}$ baking tin and line with baking parchment.
Beat the eggs and vanilla into the cooled butter and sugar mixture until well combined. Sieve in the flour and baking powder, then gently fold until you have a smooth batter. Fold in the white chocolate, then put in the prepared tin. Smooth the top and bake for 40-45 mins until the edges are coming away from the sides of the tin, the top has a papery crust and a skewer inserted into the middle comes out with a few crumbs, but no liquid batter. The blondies will firm up as they cool. Leave to cool in the tin for 10 mins, then transfer to a wire rack to cool completely.
