Class 72 Jubilee Top Vase *(for Trophy)*

A vase of mixed flowering stems containing a total of between 5 and 10 stems, taken from a minimum of 2 different KINDS of plants: 2 varieties of the same plant are NOT 2 kinds. Only fresh HOMEGROWN flowers may be used. Stems used must show flowers only and not berries or seed heads.

The vase can be any shape, size and be in proportion to the display. There are no marks for the vase. No accessories, or additional foliage will be allowed. Only foliage which is attached naturally to the flowers will be allowed. Packaging material – including floral foam – to keep the stems in place is allowed. The vase will be viewed from all directions.

Class 123 Banana Bread

140g butter softened, plus extra for the tin

2 large eggs, beaten

1 tsp baking powder

50g icing sugar

140g caster sugar

140g self-raising flour

2 very ripe bananas, mashed

handful dried banana chips

Heat oven to 180°C / 160°C fan / gas 4. Butter a 2lb loaf tin and line the base and sides with baking parchment.

Cream 140g softened butter and 140g caster sugar until light and fluffy, then slowly add 2 beaten large eggs with a little of the 140g flour.

Fold in the remaining flour, 1 tsp baking powder and 2 mashed bananas.

Pour the mixture into the prepared tin and bake for about 50 mins, or until cooked through.

Check the loaf at 5 min intervals from around 30-40 mins in the oven by testing it with a skewer (it should be able to be inserted and removed cleanly), as the time may vary depending on the shape of your loaf tin.

Cool in the tin for 10 mins, then remove to a wire rack.

Mix 50g icing sugar with 2-3 tsp water to make a runny icing.

Drizzle the icing across the top of the cake and decorate with the banana chips.

Class 124 **Backberry, Brown Butter and Almond Squares**

300g unsalted butter	200g ground almonds
200g caster sugar	160g self-raising flour
1 tsp baking powder	½ tsp fine salt
2 lemons	3 medium eggs, lightly beaten
60ml whole milk	220g blackberries
For the topping:	40g unsalted butter
40g self-raising flour	25g caster sugar
50g flaked almonds	

Heat oven to 180°F / 160°C fan / gas 4. Grease and line a 23cm x 32cm baking tin with butter and baking paper, then butter the baking paper.

Put 300g butter in a small saucepan over a medium heat. It will initially melt, then foam, then begin to return to a pale amber colour with the milk solids dropping to the bottom of the pan. Once it's golden and smelling deliciously nutty and fragrant, pour it into a large jug or bowl and leave to cool until tepid.

Tip the ground almonds, 200g sugar, 160g flour, baking powder and salt into a mixing bowl and stir well. Finely zest both lemons into the bowl.

Make the topping in a small bowl. Rub together the butter and flour with your fingertips, then stir in the sugar and a pinch of salt. Fold in the flaked almonds.

When the brown butter is just warm to the touch, gently whisk in the eggs and milk.

Make a well in the centre of the dry ingredients, slowly pour in the butter mixture, stirring with a wooden spoon until just combined (do not over mix). Pour batter into the prepared tin, then gently smooth the top with the back of a spoon. Scatter over the blackberries, pressing them in lightly, sprinkle the flaked almond mixture over the top. Bake for 40 minutes or until the top is golden and a skewer comes out clean. Leave in tin to cool for 10 mins, transfer to a wire rack to cool completely.

Exhibitors are advised to mark the underside of containers.
3. **Plants in Pots:** Pots shall not exceed 10" (inside diameter) unless otherwise stated.
4. All exhibits must be clean, free from private marks and conform strictly to the schedule.
5. Judges decision is final as regards the merit of the exhibit(s).
6. All produce must be exhibitor's own growing.
7. No one shall be present in the Marquee during judging, except Judges and Stewards. **Judging will commence at 12 noon on Saturday 5th July.** The Marquee will be open from 10am on Sunday 6th July for viewing.
8. The judges decision shall be final and he/she has the power to vary the number of prizes according to merit. In the event of a tie for a trophy, competitors will each hold it for an equal period.
9. All trophies are perpetual challenge trophies and cannot be won outright. All trophies remain the property of Wrangle Show and holders are held responsible for any loss or damage incurred while in their possession.
All trophies to be returned to the Committee by 20th June 2026.
10. **Points awarded:** 1st 4 points, 2nd 2 points, 3rd 1 point.
